in its Divine Mercy Chapel

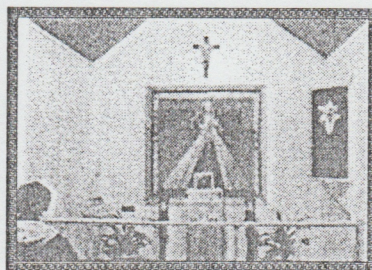
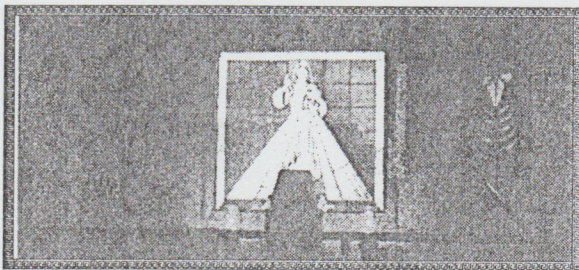
