ADORATION CHAPEL LIBRARY GUIDELINES & RESOURCES

Guidelines

A chapel library and librarian play an important role in nourishing the faith and prayer life of adorers.

The first and main thing would be to have only printed matter/books that are completely *orthodox/faithful* to the authentic teachings and Faith of the Catholic Church.

People in the parish may want to donate second hand books to the chapel. Screen resources for fidelity to Church doctrine and teachings before putting them in the chapel. Anything that is heretical should not be used as people will fall into error or sin - we need to be responsible and prevent that from happening.

So as to keep resources from disappearing, *label books* with a message, such as: "Please leave this book at the Adoration chapel" or "For use in the adoration chapel only" or "Property of X parish adoration chapel library".

Since people don't need to sign out books like a regular library, you don't need a sign out system or catalogue, although you can keep a record of what materials are in the chapel. Some parishes do have a library, where people borrow and take books home. You could do that, but it is not a necessity at adoration chapels.

Every so often you can look over the books and see what might need to be replaced or recovered; you might also wish to stock the chapel with additional resources.

Quality not quantity - you don't have to provide lots of books, or all at once.

Good books definitely do help to draw and retain people to the chapel, to learn how to pray and about our beloved Catholic Faith and Jesus and Mary. They are especially useful during periods of spiritual dryness when prayer is more challenging and to combat distractions. Some cannot stay without a book. Avid readers will devour books like food and water, so keep adding to your collection.

There is no set format for making a Holy Hour. Some adorers may simply repeat the "Jesus Prayer - "Lord Jesus Christ Son of the Living God have mercy on me a sinner" or pray the Rosary by heart, and that is enough for them. As adorers advance in the spiritual life, some may not desire or use books. At this stage they may become more contemplative, preferring long

periods of silence, simply resting in God's Presence:
